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### ANOTHER WAKE UP CALL – BE AWARE AND BE PREPARED!

In the current disturbing times, personal, home and environmental security is never too far from anyone's mind. Being aware and prepared puts us in control of situations and **also gives us peace of mind**. Being aware of potential security risks means we can be pro-active instead of reactive and exposed.

Last week we said we'd put out more information for Linmeyer residents. An area we've looked at closely is the green belt areas around our suburb. These open spaces make Linmeyer great but also pose security threats.

The attached map shows 4 open greenbelt areas.

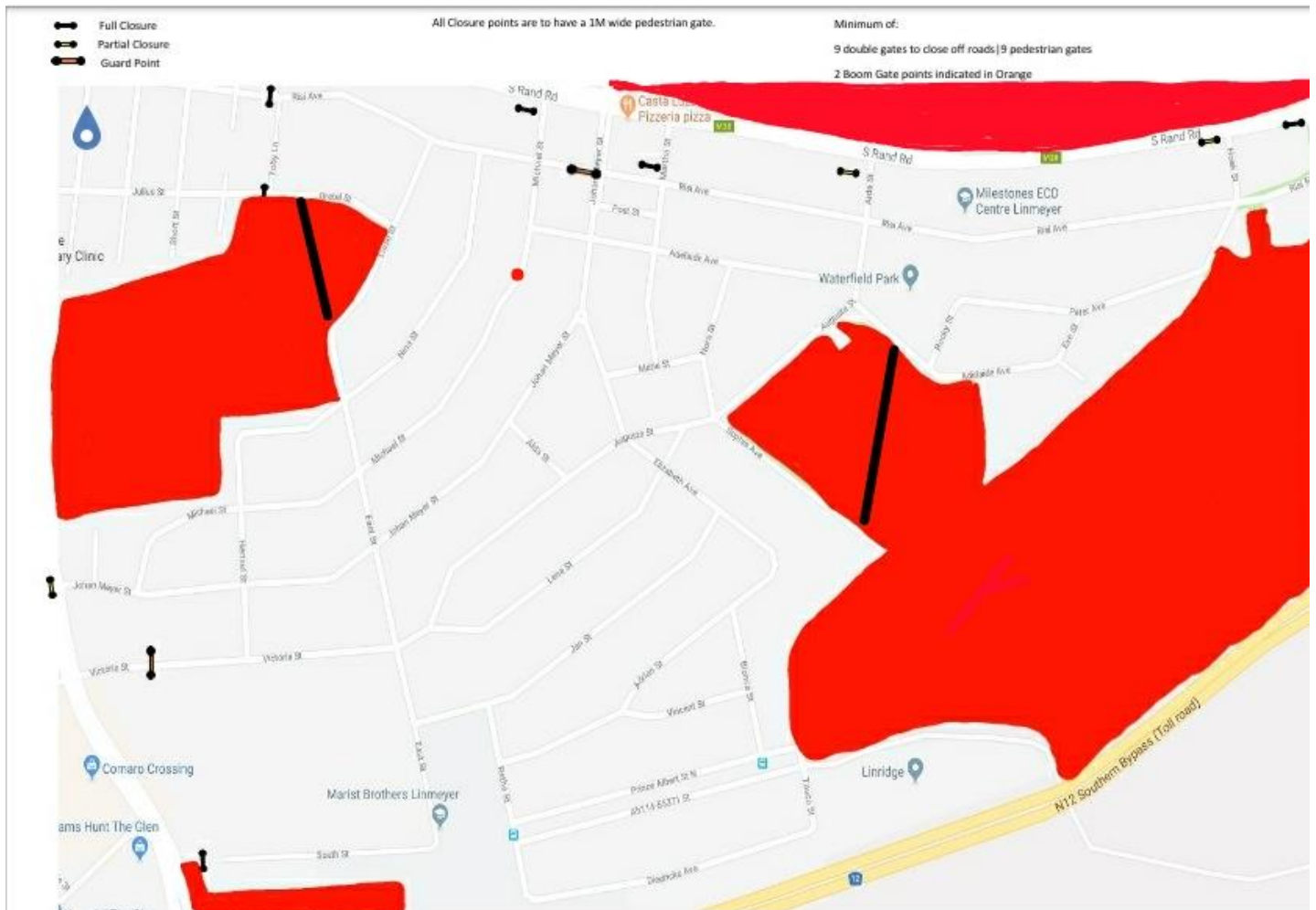
1. The veld next to South Rand Road from the Silver Ball to Car wash at corner of Johan Meyer (Top right).  
**Proposed risk control:** We need a commitment from the developer to erect a fence at the beginning of the development project.
2. Starting at the koppie at Hoek and Risi, the green area runs behind the homes in Peter Road, past Waterfield Park apartments and all the way down to Sophie Street and on to Prince Albert Street below Linridge, and down to the Motorway. (Bottom right)  
**Proposed risk control:** Erect a fence from the about the corner of Rocky down to Sophie Street.
3. At the west end of Risi – near the "Mountain / Koppie", Luise, East and Gretel Streets are vulnerable, allowing uncontrolled access into Linmeyer. There is a Council fence between Linmeyer and Southern Suburbs Sports Club, but parts of the fence have been stolen; on the Mountain and along Oak St and the back of Southern Suburbs Sports Club. (Middle left)  
**Proposed risk control:** Repair / replace the fencing. Fencing materials are available but we need community assistance and labour to do this work.
4. The bottom of South Road behind Sashan towards the Comaro onramp. (Bottom centre)  
**Proposed risk control:** Keep the grass and bush down. Add fencing as a mini-incorporation of the closure.

The **2 black lines** on the map are where fencing needs to be repaired / replaced / erected.

**Residents**, we need community support and money to do this. Everyone benefits from security upgrades, but some complain without making any contributions or assisting with community projects, **please make sure you are contributing to the present closure, Linmeyer needs your help and support.**

We will send out a cost estimate for above proposals and a prioritised time plan.

In the meantime, please give us your feedback and comments; and think about what you can offer to assist with these projects.
